A MESSAGE FROM THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR

Looking Forward to the Best School Year Ever

After experiencing the last few school years, I am happy to say that this year is feeling very different. In fact, the contrast is so great, that from my view, it looks to be one of the best years ever. Although that may seem like an overly optimistic statement, I have facts to back the statement up.

First of all, our building improvement projects are being completed as scheduled. At a time of material delays and shortages, I am pleased to announce that upon returning to school, you will see newly finished floors and completed roofing replacements at Trempealeau Elementary; new cabinetry in the classrooms of Ettrick Elementary; and upgraded restrooms at Galesville Elementary. At G-E-T Middle School a concrete pad has been poured and is ready for our high school students to begin building a garage this fall. All in all, our school buildings are prepped and ready to go.

Just like most school districts across the nation, we experienced a higher rate of employee turnover at the end of the last school year. Over the summer, we hired over a dozen teachers, several pupil service professionals, and administrators. At the time of writing this message, we have filled nearly all our staffing needs—that's just not the case for many other schools. We are one of the lucky ones.

Furthermore, by using our ESSER grant funds strategically, we hired additional interventionist teachers at all three elementary schools to address pandemic-related learning gaps. We also used this funding to increase counseling staff for the coming year so that we can ensure that every school has dedicated school counselor and that students will have greater access to emotional health support agencies.

In addition to information above, my positive expectations for 2022-23 are also fueled by the knowledge that our students will be surrounded by dedicated, caring people each day that they attend school in the G-E-T district. Our staff has done amazing work during the most difficult years that schools have ever faced. Just imagine what is in store for our children when lengthy quarantines and isolations no longer interrupt their learning, and staff can once again implement instructional strategies where students collaborate within 3 feet of each other!

So, yes, I am optimistic about the coming school year. It is truly looking like 2022-23 will be one of the best school years ever!

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Parents:

Did you know that you can submit electronic payments for your child's lunch money?

The Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District uses a service called e~Funds to collect lunch money and other assessed student fees such as athletic fees. You can sign up for your account by visiting the District Website (www.getschools.org) and click on the Payments button at the top of the window OR visit the e~Funds site for our district directly: https://payments.efundsforschools.com/v3/districts/56123

When signing up for your parent account, you will need your child's student number. You can add multiple children to your parent account, making it easy to apply a single payment for all children in the family. If you are unsure about your child's student number, contact the building secretary where your child attends school.

Please note that there are convenience fees associated with payments submitted. When submitting a payment using a debit card or checking account, the fee is \$1.25 with a maximum \$200 transaction. When submitting a payment using a credit card, the fee is 2.85% of the transaction amount.



TRANSPORTATION



Bus Routes: In Town Pick-up of Students

There are bus stops available to students living within city or village limits. Generally, a student living less than two (2) miles from his/her school of attendance may be transported if he/she is on the regular bus route, and if his/her presence on the bus does not create an overload. Students in grades 1-12 residing within ½ mile of a school will not be transported. (See board policy 751.1 for exceptions.) Times and buses vary from morning to evening and are generally determined only a few days before school starts. City pick-up of students will be at the following designated stops:

STUDENT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES Policy 751

The policies, rules, and regulations for the transportation of students to and from school shall be in strict compliance with statutory provisions, the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction regulations and the rules/ regulations established by the Board of Education of the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District.

The parents/guardians are responsible for students using school buses until the students board the bus for school and after the student gets off the bus on the return trip. In the interest of the safety of our youngest riders, a parent or responsible person, 12 years old or older, must be present, at the bus stop, to receive a kindergartner or younger student. If no one is present, the student will be returned to their home school or bus garage, and it will be the parent's responsibility to pick up the child.

DELINQUENT LUNCH ACCOUNTS

Policy 763

The Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District is concerned about the nutritional welfare of our students, and provides an excellent breakfast and lunch program.

The Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District uses an automated school food service accounting system to record payments and sales. The system functions as a debit system, similar to a checking account. A positive balance must be maintained in order for the student to participate in the lunch, milk and ala carte program. Parents/guardians who believe that the financial condition of their family qualifies for free or reduced meals shall be encouraged to make written application in accordance with the National School Lunch Act guidelines. Prior to the start of the school year, applications for free and reduced meals will be sent to every family with children enrolled in the school district. Applications can also be obtained through the District Office.

Payment reminders will be generated when an account balance is below \$5.00. If an account has an \$8.00 negative balance, no further credit will be extended. At that point students must provide cash per meal until their account has been brought current.

For students in grades Kindergarten through 8th, if the parent/guardian fails to provide the student with a meal, the District will provide the student a sandwich and a beverage for maximum of five (5) school days. After five (5) school days if the parent/guardian fails to provide the student with a cold lunch or create a positive balance in the account or provide cash for lunch, the District will file a report with the Trempealeau County Department of Human Services.

A high school student whose account balance is depleted will be unable to participate in ala carte unless they pay with cash.

This policy addresses school lunches only. The school district will not deny breakfast to a student.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FREE AND REDUCED PRICE SCHOOL MEALS FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2022-23

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs K-5 \$1.75, 6-8 \$1.90, 9-12 \$2.00; lunch costs K-5 \$2.75, 6-8 \$3.10, 9-12 \$3.25. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch. This packet includes an application for free or reduced-price meal benefits, and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

- WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS?
 - All children in households receiving benefits from FoodShare, the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or W-2 cash benefits are eligible for free meals, when listed on the application.
 - Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
 - Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
 - Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
 - Children may qualify to receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is at or below the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines.

- 2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and have not been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail Scott Moline scottmoline@getschools.k12.wi.us or (608) 582-3500.
- DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application
 for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required
 information. Return the completed application to: Karen Smith karensmith@getschool.k12.wi.us or (608) 582-3500.
- 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS? Please read the letter you received carefully and follow the instructions. If your letter indicated you qualify for free meals, then no application is needed. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact Karen Smith karensmith@getschool.k12.wi.us or (608) 582-3500. immediately. If your household was notified it qualified for reduced price meals, we encourage you to complete an application to potentially qualify for free meals based on household size and income.
- DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF MY CHILD ATTENDS A COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY PROVISION SCHOOL (CEP)? If your
 child attends a school that participates in CEP, receipt of free breakfast and lunch meals does not depend on returning this
 application. However, this information is necessary for other programs and may be used to determine if your household is
 eligible for additional benefits.

- 6. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year, through October 7th, 2022, or when a new eligibility is determined. You must submit a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year. If you do not submit a new application that is approved by the school or you have not been notified that your child is eligible for free meals, your child will be charged the full price for meals.
- I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals, but it is based on income. Please submit an application.
- MY CHILD(REN) QUALIFIES FOR BADGERCARE PLUS OR MEDICAID. CAN MY CHILD GET FREE MEALS? Children with BadgerCare Plus, Medicaid, or subsidized insurance <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced-price meals, but it is based on household income and household size. Please submit an application to determine if your household qualifies.
- WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
- 10. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed or experience a financial hardship may become eligible for free and reduced-price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials. You also
 may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Larry Moore, 24882 1st Street, Trempealeau, WI 54661. (608-534-6175)
- MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced-price meals.
- 13. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you <u>normally</u> receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 14. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application, or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will <u>also</u> be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you meant to do so.
- 15. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Do not include any combat pay resulting from deployment as income.
- WHAT IF THERE IS NOT ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper and attach it to your application.
- MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP. ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR? To find out how to apply for FoodShare or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or call 1-800-362-3002.

Please use these instructions to help you fill out the application for free or <u>reduced price</u> school meals. You only need to submit one application per household, even if your children attend more than one school in [School District]. The application must be filled out completely to certify your children for free or <u>reduced price</u> school meals. If anyone in your household (including you) currently participates in one or more of the assistance programs listed below, your children are eligible for free school meals:

- The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or FoodShare.
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or W-2 Cash Benefits
- The Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR).

A) If no one in your household participates in any of the above listed programs:

- Leave STEP 2 blank or check "No" and go to STEP 3.
- B) If anyone in your household participates in any of the above assistance programs:
- Write a case number and name of the assistance program you or any member of the household participates in one of these programs and do not know your case number, contact your case worker. Medicaid and for FoodShare, W-2 Cash Benefits, or FDPIR. You only need to provide one case number. If you participate in BadgerCare case numbers do NOT qualify for free or reduced price meals
- Go to STEP 4.

STEP 3: REPORT INCOME FOR ALL HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS

How do I report my income?

- Use the charts titled "Sources of Income for Children" and "Sources of Income for Adults," printed on the back side of the application form, to determine if your household has income to report.
- think of income as the amount they "take home" (listed as "net pay" on paycheck stub) and not the total, "gross" amount. Make sure that the income you report on this Report all amounts in GROSS INCOME ONLY. Report all income in whole dollars. Do not include cents. Gross income is the total income received before taxes. Many people application has NOT been reduced to pay for taxes, insurance premiums, or any other amounts taken from your pay.

STEP 3: REPORT INCOME FOR ALL HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS

- Write a "0" in any fields where there is no income to report. Any income fields left empty or blank will also be counted as a zero. If you write '0' or leave any fields blank, you are certifying (promising) that there is no income to report. If local officials suspect that your household income was reported incorrectly, your application will be
- Mark how often each type of income is received using the boxes to the right of each field

3.A. REPORT INCOME EARNED BY CHILDREN

Only count foster children's personal income if you are applying for them together with the rest of your household A) Report all income earned or received by children. Report the combined gross income for ALL children listed in STEP 1 in your household in the box marked "Child Income."

What is Child Income? Child income is money received from outside your household that is paid DIRECTLY to your children. Many households do not have any child income

3.B. REPORT INCOME EARNED BY ADULTS

List adult household members' names.

- Print the name of each household member in the boxes marked "Name of Adult Household Members (First and Last)." When filling out this section, please include ALL adult members in your household who are living with you and share income and expenses, even if they are not related and even if they do not receive income of their own.
- Do NOT include:
- People who live with you but are not supported by your household's income AND do not contribute income to your household
- Infants, children and students already listed in STEP 1.

C) Report earnings from work. Report all total gross income (before taxes) from work in the "Earnings from Work" field on the application. This is usually the money received from working at jobs. If you are a self-employed business or farm owner, you will report your net income.

What if I am self-employed? Report income from that work as a net amount. This is calculated by subtracting the total operating expenses of your business from its gross receipts or revenue.

F) Fluctuating Income. For seasonal workers and others whose income fluctuates and usually earn more money in some months than others. In these situations, project the annual rate of income and report that. This includes workers with annual employment contracts but may choose to have salaries paid over a shorter period of time; for example, school employees.

D) Report income from public assistance/child support/alimony/SSI/VA benefits. Report all income that applies in the "Public Assistance/Child Support/Alimony" field on the application. Do not report the cash value of any public assistance benefits NOT listed on the chart. If income is received from child support or alimony, only report court-ordered payments. Informal but regular payments should be reported as "other" income in the next part.

G) Report total household size. Enter the total number of household members in the field "Total Household Members (Children and Adults)." This number MUST be equal to the number of household members listed in STEP 1 and STEP 3. If there are any members of your household that you have not listed on the application, go back and add them. It is very important to list all household members, as the size of your household affects your eligibility for free and reduced price meals.

E) Report income from pensions/retirement/all other income.

H) Provide the last four digits of your Social Security Number (SSN). An adult household member must enter the last four digits of their SSN in the space provided. CURRICULUM CORNER



Teachers in the months of June and July engaged in various curriculum development activities as well as continued professional learning. Kindergarten, first, and second-grade teachers attended an all-day virtual training that provided additional knowledge in best teaching practices for utilizing our phonics resource. Kindergarten through fourth-grade teachers updated unit and lesson plans aligned with the science standards. Additional resources were identified and assessments were improved to address the performance expectations; planning investigations, collecting data, and reporting findings just to name a few. While planning for these units and lessons teachers continued to gain new science knowledge and a better understanding of best science teaching practices.

Teachers in grades Kindergarten through four reviewed the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction's suggested scope and sequence for social studies and began identifying needed resources.

Our middle school teachers continue to fine-tune instruction and assessment of priority standards in their respective content areas. Of particular note, social studies teachers have been involved in the training of a new resource to enhance the social studies curriculum.

A team of teachers from across the district and across the grade levels and content areas will be attending a Professional Learning Community Institute in Minneapolis during the second week of August. Under District Administrator, Michele Butler's leadership we continue to grow and learn in ways to best support student learning through our PLCs. This institute will further our mission in *providing an education based upon a strong academic foundation in order to equip our students with the skills to be productive and responsible citizens.*

As we look to the 2022-23 school year, we continue to be hopeful that the pandemic is in the rearview mirror and that we can capitalize on the positive skills and dispositions we gained. We all are more resilient and flexible which will be to our advantage in the new school year.

All High School students will attend school starting Monday, August 29th.





The Youth Apprenticeship program is available to junior and senior level students who have shown interest in a YA-supported career pathway, have taken courses aligned with the career pathway, and have a teacher recommendation. Students must also commit to take at least two courses that align with their chosen career pathway in the participating school year while maintaining a positive student status.



ANNUAL NOTICES

At the beginning of each school year, school districts are required to provide certain annual notices. These notices are as follows:

HOMELESS EDUCATION PROGRAM

It is the policy of the Board of Education of the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District to ensure that homeless children and youth are provided with equal access to its educational programs, have an opportunity to meet the same challenging State of Wisconsin and school district academic standards, and are not segregated on the basis of their status as homeless. In addition, it is the district's policy to establish safeguards that protect homeless students from discrimination on the basis of their homelessness.

Definition of Homeless Children and Youth:

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act defines homeless children and youth as individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. The term includes children and youth who:

- temporarily share the housing of other persons due to the loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason;
- · live in motels, hotels, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations;
- live in emergency or transitional shelters;
- are abandoned in hospitals:
- have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings;
- live in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
- are runaway children or children who are abandoned.

Migratory children and unaccompanied youth (youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian) may be considered homeless if they meet the above definition.

Homeless status is determined in cooperation with parents or in the case of unaccompanied youth the local educational agency liaison. The Pupil Services Director is the designated Homeless Liaison for the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District.

NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY

It is the policy of the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District that no person may be denied admission to any public school in this district or be denied participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, extracurricular, pupil service, recreational, or other program or activity because of the person's sex, race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability as required by section 118.13 of the state statutes. This policy also prohibits student discrimination under Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (sex), Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race, color, national origin), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (handicap) and Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (disability).

The district encourages informal resolution of complaints under this policy. A formal complaint resolution procedure is available, however, to address allegations of violations of this policy in the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District.

The Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District offers a variety of educational options to children who reside in the District.

The District's primary educational pathway and instructional program for students involves a progression from 4-year-old kindergarten through 12- grade, leading to a high school diploma.

The District's schools, and each school's most recent state-assigned performance category (if available), are listed below:

Some of the specific education programs offered to eligible students who are enrolled in and attending the District's schools include the following:

- Early childhood special education (for students who are at least 3 years old but not yet school-age)
- Special education programs and services for students with disabilities
- English language learner programming
- Gifted and talented education
- Career and Technical Education (CTE) options
- An education for employment program
- Individualized program and curriculum modifications
- Alternative education program(s)
- At-risk education (e.g., for students identified as being at-risk of not graduating from high school)
- Summer school programming

Educational options for students who are enrolled in the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District that involve part-time attendance to attend courses at an educational institution other than a school of the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District include the following:

- The Part-time Open Enrollment Program, which provides opportunities for public high school students to apply for approval to take up to 2 courses at a time in nonresident school districts.
- The Technical College Course Program ("Start College Now" Program), which
 - o provides opportunities to apply for approval to take courses at technical colleges; and
 - is available only to students who are enrolled in the 11th or 12th grade.
- The Early College Credit Program, which
 - provides opportunities to apply for approval to take nonsectarian courses at institutions of higher education; and
 - is available to eligible high school students.

Additional educational options for children who reside in the District that involve full-time enrollment/attendance at a school, program, or other educational institution that is not a school or instrumentality of the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District include the following:

- High school students meeting certain age and other eligibility requirements may be permitted to attend a technical college or certain other programs for the purpose of completing a program leading to the student's high school graduation or to a high school equivalency diploma.
- Full-time Open Enrollment involving physical attendance in a public school of a nonresident school district or attendance through a virtual charter school that is associated with a nonresident school district.
- A child with a disability who meets the program's specific eligibility requirements may apply to attend an eligible, participating private school under a scholarship awarded through the state's "Special Needs Scholarship Program," as established under section 115.7915 of the state statutes.
- Enrollment in a private school of the family's choosing (at the family's own cost, as applicable).
- · Enrollment in a home-based private educational program as provided under state law.

Educational options for children who reside in the Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District but who are enrolled in and attending a private school, or home-based private educational program include the following:

- Such students have the opportunity to attend summer school classes/programs offered in the District.
- Private school students in the high school grades have the opportunity to apply for approval to take up two courses per semester in a District school, pursuant to section 118.145(4) of the state statutes.
- Students who are enrolled in a home-based private educational program have the opportunity to:
 - Apply for approval to take up to two courses per semester in public schools as provided under section 118.53 of the state statutes.
 - Participate in District interscholastic athletics and other District extracurricular activities as provided under section 118.133 of the state statutes.
